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


SIKKA ART & DESIGN FESTIVAL



AT THE SPEED OF SADU | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

This artwork features rotating sadu disks projected onto the façade of an old heritage house in Al Shindagha, symbolizing the dynamic and ever-evolving nature of culture. The traditional sadu patterns, deeply rooted in Emirati heritage, come to life as they spin at varying speeds, creating a mesmerizing interplay of movement and light against the stillness of the historic architecture. The speed of the rotations evokes a parallel with the speed of light, suggesting how quickly culture can adapt and transform when propelled by innovation and change.

This contrast highlights the coexistence of tradition and progress, reflecting how culture, while grounded in its origins, evolves at a pace shaped by contemporary influences. The artwork invites viewers to contemplate the fluidity of identity, the rapidity of adaptation, and the delicate balance between preserving heritage and embracing the future in an ever-accelerating world.

This musical piece revolves around coastal maritime Ayyala, envisioned through a futuristic lens. Al-Ayyala has long been one of the most prominent coastal arts celebrated by the people of the UAE on various occasions. This work seeks to reinterpret this art form, infusing it with a futuristic character while preserving the authenticity of this heritage.

Al-Bariha is a folkloric chant from the Al-Ayyala repertoire, traditionally sung by men as they reflect on the challenges they face during their pearl diving journeys. The choirs of this chant have been performed using artificial intelligence techniques.

DATES = IR | ORGANIC DATES AND METAL CONDUCTORS, 2025

This artwork is a captivating art installation that harmonizes the timeless essence of nature with the contemporary era of technology. Through a series of meticulously adorned dates, the artwork symbolizes the resurgence of the palm tree as a provider of energy in today's world. Once essential lifelines in the UAE, palm trees offered shade, sustenance, and shelter to communities. Despite technological advancements diminishing traditional reliance on palm trees, this artwork serves as a poignant reminder of nature's enduring power. Each date, infused with energy-producing potential, represents the palm tree's continued relevance as a sustainable source of vitality, transforming from a staple of survival to a symbol of resilience and adaptation in the face of changing times.

REALIITY

UAE BASED MOSS-BEHAVING | VIDEO, 2025

This artwork presents a thought-provoking exploration of reality and artifice by blending traditional photography with Al-generated alterations. A photo of the historic Al Shindagha neighborhood in Dubai is processed through a generative Al model, which introduces elements of moss to the scenes. Some of the results are so seamlessly integrated that they challenge our perception of reality, blurring the lines between the authentic and the artificial. However, other outputs are exaggerated, with the moss overtaking the scenes in ways that are clearly unreal. This contrast invites viewers to consider where the boundary lies between enhancement and distortion, prompting reflection on the point at which technology's influence becomes too overt, shifting from subtle augmentation to something obviously fabricated.

THE OASIS WITHIN | DIGITAL MEDIA, 2025

This artwork presents a beautiful transformation: a photograph of barren, cracked earth and a lifeless palm tree, brought to life through generative AI. The image is imbued with vibrant greens and thriving foliage, reimagining the scene as it might appear if the land had been carefully nurtured. The revitalized palm, once dry and desolate, now stands tall amidst lush surroundings, hinting at the untapped potential within nature when given attention and care.

This digital intervention invites viewers to reflect on the possibilities of revival, sparking a hopeful contemplation of what could be if we prioritized the land's restoration.

ROOTS AND TOWERS | DIGITAL MEDIA, 2025

This artwork is a series of three holograms depicting the evolving relationship between tradition and modernity in the UAE. In the first hologram, a towering structure gradually replaces a palm tree, symbolizing the encroachment of modernity upon heritage. In the second, the palm tree and tower stand side by side, representing a delicate balance between past and present. In the third, the two forms merge into a seamless hybrid, illustrating a future where cultural roots and technological advancement are intertwined. This progression captures the UAE's journey, honoring its past while embracing a vision where tradition and innovation coexist harmoniously.

TEMPO OF EMOTIONS | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

The artwork features a unique clock integrated with a camera that employs an AI algorithm to predict the viewer's mood. This innovative piece connects the subjective experience of time with emotional states, dynamically adjusting the speed of the clock based on the viewer's detected mood. When the viewer is happy, time seems to fly as the clock speeds up, reflecting the common feeling of joy making moments pass quickly. Conversely, when the viewer is sad, the clock slows down, mirroring the sensation of time dragging during periods of melancholy. This thought-provoking installation explores the intimate relationship between our emotions and our perception of time, offering a reflective and immersive experience that underscores the fluid nature of time as influenced by our inner world.

This artwork is an evocative artwork inspired by the principles of quantum physics. It features a screen displaying binary code in distinct colors. Initially, the binary codes remain separate, symbolizing individual streams of information. Gradually, the codes begin to intermix, representing human communication and connection. As the screen reaches a balanced mix of both colored codes, the artwork beautifully illustrates love and harmony, reflecting the synchronization of two souls. Suddenly, the colors retreat to their original corners, depicting separation. Yet, traces of the foreign binary code persist, conveying that those we connect with leave an indelible mark, a piece of them always residing within us. This artwork sheds light on the enduring impact of love and communication, reminding us that those we connect with leave a lasting imprint on our souls.

MOMENTS | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

This artwork is a profound exploration of the intricate rings of life, depicted through a series of metallic rings of varying diameters, all rotating about an axis. These rings, driven by a motor, converge at a single point, symbolizing the intersection of different lives at a particular moment in space and time. As the rings rotate, they occasionally clash, producing sounds that echo the interactions—both significant and fleeting—that occur in these chance encounters. The artwork serves as a metaphor for the connections we often overlook, reminding us of the profound impact of these coincidences. At times, the rings pause, creating a moment of silence that reflects the interruptions in life's continuous flow. These moments invite viewers to pause and reflect on the value of the brief intersections we experience with others, emphasizing the fragile and interconnected nature of our existence.

UAE | ART + TECH COLLECTIVE, SUPPORTED BY REALIITY EPOCHS OF MEMORIES | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

The artwork captures the transformation of memories through analog photography and Al. It highlights the fragmented and elusive nature of their memories—mirrored in the half-burned analog images. In an attempt to restore the gaps in memories, Powered by human input, Al can reconstruct and reimagine these lost fragments. The more detailed the input, the more precise and vivid the restoration. It is here that the line between recollection and creation blurs—where technology becomes a conduit for mnemonic imagination, allowing us to push the boundaries of what can be imagined. We show the iterative nature of memory in which multiple refinements bring the restoration closer to reality, demonstrating how Al can deepen our connection to memories that might otherwise be discarded. Through this process, we begin to see that memories, like the images, are never truly lost, only waiting to be restored.

A generative digital artwork that visualizes the ever-changing patterns of sand dunes through dynamic flow fields. Tiny particles, symbolizing grains of sand, follow random yet intentional pathways, forming and dispersing into intricate, shifting patterns. Using gradients that reflect natural desert light, the piece captures the beauty of dunes shaped by invisible forces, inviting viewers to contemplate nature's quiet resilience and timeless patterns.

Like the desert, this digital representation studies ephemerality and resilience, reminding us that while sand may seem transient, its forms are timeless and endlessly renewing. The piece contemplates the subtle forces shaping our world and the quiet, persistent beauty of nature's most intricate patterns. Each viewing reveals a unique, unrepeatable moment in this fluid desert landscape.

DUST DEVIL 1 | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

This installation offers a never before seen technological and sensory experience based on a fundamental cosmogonic narrative. Referring to the mysteries of nature in the age of global warming, rooted in a cultural language that has evolved from the UAE's distinct desert landscape, the installation translates an atmospheric phenomenon that can be experienced in the desert with an electromagnetic sand tornado. This installation invites us into a sensory experience made of vibrations and movements more than anthropomorphic or recognizable representations. In doing so the artist presents a reminder of the fragility and resilience of the traditional landscape in the critical age of Anthropocene.

THE FROGS IN THE POND | STAINLESS STEEL, LINEAR ACTUATORS, WOOD, MAGNETS, IRON, ALUMINIUM, SHABAKA ARDUINO BOARD, WIRES, ELECTRICITY, 2025

The Frogs in the Pond transforms traditional Palestinian patterns into a living, evolving experience. Inspired by the fleeting nature of memory, the installation reflects the tension between visibility and erasure. Patterns emerge and dissolve, echoing the delicate balance between cultural loss and resilience. Opaque layers obscure the intricate designs beneath, inviting viewers into a meditative process of discovery and renewal.

Much like frogs appearing and vanishing in a still pond, the artwork evokes the cyclical nature of heritage—always shifting, yet deeply rooted. By merging the ephemeral with the timeless, the piece becomes a poetic metaphor for the fragility of memory and the enduring power of tradition in the face of change.

O JUSTICE | 7 SERVO MOTORS, METAL SET UP AND COMPUTER GEN-ERATED CODE, 2025

Inspired by the infinite monkey theorem and quantum entanglement, O Justice explores the relationship between perception and meaning, order and chaos, intention and synchronicity. It poses the hypothesis: Can human consciousness affect computer-generated code?

The installation is driven by seven arms, each powered by an independent servo motor connected to a network, generating random movements based on the premise that the presence of a viewer introduces a human bioenergetic field—an intersection of consciousness and quantum mechanics—potentially influencing particle behavior.

O Justice generates a sequence of probabilities and unpredictable outcomes, questioning whether ultimate synchronicity—or even absolute order—can ever be attained.

THE DANCE OF HORIZONS | STEPPER MOTOR, SENSOR, AND PRO-GRAMMABLE BOARD, METAL COMPONENTS, ILLUMINATED SPHERES WITH LED LIGHTS, 2025

This artwork explores the intricate relationship between time and human consciousness. Through the seamless motion of two illuminated spheres—representing the sun and the moon—viewers are invited to reflect on the fluidity of time. As they approach, the movement slows, echoing the way mindfulness can stretch moments, while distance accelerates the rhythm, mimicking the unnoticed passage of time.

Encased within a minimalist hourglass-like frame, the installation asks: Do we shape time with our awareness, or does time shape us? By intertwining light, motion, and interaction, this artwork offers a poetic meditation on the interplay of presence, perception, and the short-lived nature of existence.

THE SACRED MATRIX | 51 3D-PRINTED MUQARNAS UNITS, EACH INTE-GRATED WITH A SERVO MOTOR, 2025

The Sacred Matrix reimagines the timeless geometry of Islamic Muqarnas as a living, breathing cosmos of radiance and motion. Patterns emerge and dissolve in a mesmerising dance, drawing visitors into an ethereal interplay of colour, shadow, and form.

This kinetic installation bridges ancient tradition and contemporary design, blending heritage with innovation to create a meditative yet dynamic experience. The Sacred Matrix is a reflective exploration of infinity, divine connection, and the resilience of culture, inviting participants to engage with the beauty and significance of Muqarnas in a modern, ever-evolving context.

UAE QASEEDA BELA KALIMAT (A POEM WITHOUT WORDS) | MIXED MEDIA, 2025

This artwork reimagines the rhythm and meter of Arabic poetry as a multidimensional experience, fusing art and technology. Eight transparent cylinders, arranged to resemble poetic verses, rotate to generate sound patterns inspired by the Bahar Al Baseet, an Arabic poetry meter. The cylinders produce sounds as they rotate, via coding and motors, making the rhythmic patterns audible and offering a sensory experience of the meter.

The work is accompanied by poetry written in the same meter, highlighting the universality of

poetic rhythm. The wood supporting piece symbolizes the balance and structure created by the meter, transforming poetic rhythm into a multi-faceted experience. Qaseeda Bela Kalimat invites the audience to explore poetry as a rhythm that transcends words.

This metal sculpture explores Basic Architectural principles of spatial interaction, materiality, and the relationship between form and void. Featuring movable pieces, the sculpture transforms into multiple iterations, showcasing how space can be redefined and reimagined through movement. It invites viewers to engage with the evolving interplay of solid and void, highlighting themes of temporality, adaptability, and transformation. Each configuration shifts the perception of space, emphasizing the dynamic relationship between form and its surrounding environment. The project celebrates the ever-changing nature of space, material, and form, encouraging reflection on how spatial boundaries can be fluid and open to reinterpretation.



When a foreign object, like a grain of sand or small organism, enters their bodies, it prompts the secretion of substances that coat and protect it, eventually forming pearls and coral. Though they thrive in saltwater, some coral species also grow in freshwater, reflecting the balance of creation. This adaptability symbolizes resilience and beauty born from challenges. Our research explores the merging and layering of materials from coral and pearl, experimenting with different types of water to observe their interactions and potential for new material development.

Invisible openwork spaces are surrounded by perpendicular walls, edges and corners that emerge with the stone. These spaces are filtered through the prism of a "mathematical" formula based on the three spatial planes that define physical space. Simultaneously, they are reminiscent of the architectural structure of buildings, streets and squares.

As one moves around it, this circle gradually transforms into a crescent, directed upwards towards the sky. Arabic calligraphy occupies an important space within this circle, forming its upper arc. This script radiates light, representing our Arab-Islamic identity, always shining and glittering. I envisioned the letters to be intertwined, cohesive, and harmonious, with a balanced form that appears identical from both sides. The viewer should not perceive the letters are inverted or distorted on one side, but rather as a seamless, unified whole.

CRADLE OF CREATION | PAINTED RATTAN, METAL STRUCTURE, 2025

In Surah Al-Rahman, verse 22 (أن المَوْنِ مَرْخَلَ المَوْنِ مَرْخَيَ) (From both of them emerge pearl and coral), the verse highlights the divine creation of two remarkable treasures. Both gems form in layers, symbolizing gradual perfection over time. When a foreign object, like a grain of



sand or small organism, enters their bodies, it prompts the secretion of substances that coat and protect it, eventually forming pearls and coral. Though they thrive in saltwater, some coral species also grow in freshwater, reflecting the balance of creation. This adaptability symbolizes resilience and beauty born from challenges. Our research explores the merging and layering of materials from coral and pearl, experimenting with different types of water to observe their interactions and potential for new material development.

Merin Pavilion is a modular architectural structure inspired by the Burj Rashid in Dubai, with its distinctive façade rooted in Islamic and Arabic architectural motifs. Designed to embody adaptability, sustainability, and engagement, the pavilion reinterprets traditional forms and temporal structures through its use of thick shade fabric and wooden framework.

Stemmed from the concept of tents being "Moveable Palace", Merin is crafted to allow for diverse configurations, enabling the pavilion to adapt to various functional needs. From the colonnade to the courtyard, Merin introduces dynamic possibilities for creating meaningful public realms while honoring local architectural heritage.

Honoring the ancient art of creating charcoal from Samra and Sidr trees, the piece integrates traditional practices with modern artistic expression to preserve local environmental and agricultural knowledge from bedouin practices.




